

Welcome

On behalf of Nova Voce, Nova Scotia's Provincial men's choir, it is my distinct honour and privilege, as the recently re-elected President of this fine body of men, to bid you welcome to our 2025/26 season of concerts.

Nova Voce's Halifax home, more appropriately known as Kjipuktuk, is located in Mi'kma'ki, the ancestral and unceded territory of the Mi'kmaq People, whom we acknowledge as the past, present, and future caretakers of this land. This territory is covered by the Peace and Friendship Treaties which Mi'kmaq, W last kwiyik (Maliseet), and Passamaquoddy Peoples first signed with



the British Crown in 1725. The treaties did not deal with surrender of lands and resources but in fact recognized Mi'kmaq and W last kwiyik (Maliseet) title and established the rules for what was to be an ongoing relationship between nations. We are all Treaty people.

We also acknowledge that people of African descent have been in Nova Scotia for over 400 years, and we honour and offer gratitude to the ancestors of those who came before us to this land. Together with the rich and diverse cultural and artistic contributions from the Celtic, Acadian, and so many other traditions, our unique melting pot of musicality continues to produce iconic and distinctive material that lays bare the soul of every Nova Scotian. Although I have the misfortune to have been born far from these shores, it took me no time at all to realise on my arrival that the very specific sense of belonging that Nova Scotians' fundamental connection with music engenders has a universality that Nova Voce exists to preserve and popularise.

With our continuing commitment to fulfilling that significant role, we aim to build on the momentum generated by our highly successful 21st season as we go forward into our 22nd with renewed vigour and confidence. We are delighted and honoured to have been invited to sing at Province House as part of the "Evenings at Government" House" series. Then, in November, in response to rave reviews last spring from audiences in Yarmouth and Annapolis Royal, we will reprise our "Pirates and Sea Shanties Concert" in Wolfville and Dartmouth. Our annual Christmas concert with the Halifax Boys Honour Choir and Sackville Brass Quintet returns to St. Andrew's United in December. In the Spring you will find us close at hand. The month of March takes us first to Dartmouth and then on to Tantallon. Later in May, at the invitation of Halifax's own Camerata Singers we will participate in their Mass Choral Festival, and then a particular highlight to bring the season to a close with two performances of Duke Ellington's Sacred Concert with Truro's Cantabile Singers and the Tuesday Night Band in Truro and Halifax. These concerts are our way of bringing you the music we love and cementing our proud claim as your Provincial men's choir. Our hope is that you will give us the opportunity to do so, again and again.

BRYAN CROCKER - CO-ARTISTIC DIRECTOR



Bryan has been conducting choirs since 2000 when he was appointed Artistic Director of the Dalhousie Health Professions Chorale. Prior to that he enjoyed being a professional saxophonist in Halifax playing with such artists/events as Ice Capades, The Moscow Circus, The Temptations, The Spinners, Rosemary Clooney, Dionne Warwick, the John Alphonse Big Band and many others.

Since that time, Bryan has continued to expand his conducting skills, and besides Nova Voce, he is also the

Artistic Director of the Halifax Gay Men's Chorus (HGMC).

Bryan sings baritone with the acclaimed Halifax Camerata Singers and is a long-standing member of the Sackville Concert Band playing baritone saxophone. He is involved with the Nova Scotia Choral Federation, and has sat on a number of planning committees, both provincially and nationally. Between weekends, in his free moments, Bryan is a casual senior analyst with Information Management & Information Technology at the Nova Scotia Health Authority after having recently retired from full-time duties.

LYNN PELTON - ACCOMPANIST

Lynn Pelton, pianist and former music educator, is a graduate of Nova Scotia Teachers College and Mount Allison University (B.Mus. Major in Performance and Music History). Lynn has previously accompanied many choirs and string groups, including The Aeolian Singers, NS Choral Federation workshops and Halifax Metro Honour Choirs. Many of the school choirs she has conducted won several awards at the N.S. Kiwanis Music Festival. In addition to working with local choral conductors, she has had the opportunity to work with many well known choral



clinicians including Mark Sirett, Mark Ramsay and Charles Bruffy.

BILL PERROT - CO-ARTISTIC DIRECTOR

Bill graduated from Westminster Choir College, Princeton, NJ, in 1975 and has been involved in school, church and community choirs since his arrival in Nova Scotia. He has been active in the Nova Scotia Choral Federation since its inception in 1976 and is also a Charter Life Member of Choral Canada. Bill is the founding conductor of Kings Chorale, a community choir established in 1982. In addition, he has conducted the Annapolis Valley Honour Choir, the Acadia University Chorus, the Acadia Vocal Ensemble, and NSCF's Youth Choir Camp. He has prepared choirs for Symphony Nova Scotia performances as well as for concerts with the



Nova Scotia Youth Orchestra. In 1994, he was the Master Conductor for the Rotary Youth Choir in Halifax, now the Nova Scotia Youth Choir. In May of 2008, Bill was given the Alumni Merit Award from Westminster Choir College for his work with choirs, particularly youth choirs, in Nova Scotia. Bill is extremely pleased to be sharing the podium with Bryan Crocker as Co-Artistic Director.

IN MEMORIAM TERRY HURRELL - CO-FOUNDING DIRECTOR 1938-2025



With the passing of Terry Hurrell in June of this year, Nova Scotia lost a giant of the musical community. When Terry Hurrell founded Nova Voce in 2004, it was only the latest in a career of musical innovation and choral direction.

After training as a music educator in England, Terry, together with his wife Stephanie, came to Nova Scotia in 1967, where he became deeply involved in the music scene. An educator, innovator, music director, composer, actor and vocalist, there is hardly a choir in Halifax and Queen's counties that hasn't felt his influence.

In addition to being the co-founder of Nova Voce, Terry was the founding music director of such diverse groups as the Lockeport Male Choir, Liverpool Boys' Choir, Halifax Boys Honour Choir, Queens County Community Choir, Nova Scotia Youth Chamber Choir, and two church handbell choirs. He was a past president and honorary life member of N.S. Music Educators' Association, a vice-president and board member of N.S. Choral Federation, a member of The Contemporary Art Society of Nova Scotia and Dartmouth Visual Arts Society.

Terry was a choir member and served on several committees at St. Matthew's United Church. He has also sung with The Halifax Camerata Singers, Symphony Nova Scotia Chorus and has directed Seton Cantata Choir and the Jubilate Singers.

Terry led Nova Voce from its founding in January 2004 until his retirement in December 2010. During his seven-year tenure with Nova Voce, he grew the choir from its infancy to performing at Canada Day celebrations in Ottawa (2005), successfully auditioning for and performing at Festival 500 in St. John's NL (2007), appearing at Podium in Sackville NB (2008) and releasing its first two CDs in 2007 and 2010. He composed and arranged many pieces of music for the choir, both before and after his retirement, and continued to work with the choir as Director Emeritus until very recently.

After the death of his wife Stephanie in 2024, Terry moved to a retirement home and promptly formed a choir, recruiting singers and an accompanist from amongst the residents there. Before his death, they were scheduled to do a tour performing at other retirement residences.

Terry had a direct and personal impact on so many people, from young people who learned choral singing from him, singers who had their first solo under his direction, choirs that he coached to perform at their very best, and colleagues who appreciated his teamwork and mentorship. Through it all, his sense of humour and his absolute passion for music shone.

As Pamela Burton, conductor of the Halifax Boys Honour Choir (HBHC) which Terry funded in 1985, said, "Though Terry is no longer with us, his legacy of kindness, leadership, and passion for music will continue to inspire. He and Stephanie will always hold a special place in our hearts."

In Terry's honor a new Talent Trust Award has been created and will be awarded later this year for the first time.


Rest in peace, Terry, and rise singing in glory!

DAVID PACKER - BASS

Growing up in Hants County, family gatherings were always filled with music. Many of my relatives either played an instrument or sang and my sister and I always tried to sing along with them, or whatever old country music was on the 8-track in the family car.

In elementary school when the teacher learned I could carry a tune, two other students and I were always given solo parts in school concerts. I also had a brief stint singing in the church choir. In high school



I picked up the guitar to accompany my voice, singing and playing along with the family. After moving to the city, I eventually got connected with the Royal Nova Scotia International Tattoo (RNSIT) adult choir in 2012 and even sang in a barbershop chorus for a little while. In 2023 a fellow RNSIT choir member invited me to join Nova Voce and the rest, as they say, is history.

These adventures produced in him a strong love of music, song and theatre. Through high school, Ron played trombone in the school band and also played bass

trombone for a short while in the West Nova Regimental Band.

- MSVU: 'Joseph's Amazing Technicolor Dreamcoat', 'Here's Love', 'The Collector', 'Alexander'
